NOUMC Financial Snapshot

This month the Finance Committee is sharing a short new report on the church's finances. We'll update this condensed summary each month going forward, to provide regular transparency to the church's financial condition for all our members and friends. For those wanting more detail, we also plan to publish full financial statements every quarter, which you can get from the office.

We will mail directly to the congregation a more comprehensive financial picture in the coming weeks, in connection with our annual stewardship campaign. Please watch for it and read it closely and prayerfully. In the meantime, we thought you would appreciate seeing this snapshot.

Our modestly sized church has an outsized impact on our community thanks to the generous direct donations of our congregation. Locally that includes targeted missions like our monthly community meal, Laura's Home, the Oxcart Food Pantry, and many others. And we contribute meaningfully to global United Methodist missions through UMCOR and other shared ministries.

However, since the beginning of the COVID-19 outbreak, we have been running a consistent deficit in our regular giving, which support our programming, our staff, and our building. That has been particularly acute in recent months, and the church leadership is watching it closely. You'll be hearing more soon about how we plan to address that deficit. In the meantime, if you have the means, please consider an increase to your regular giving to help us close this gap and ensure we can continue *Feeding our Community—Body, Mind, and Spirit*.
