


"Matchless" Bible Study: Fall Adult Morning Study

This is a Catholic Charities Mission, so we continue to serve in an ecumenical way. The mission is open to all men in need. To get this charity kicked off in style, August's Penny Sunday collection will go towards funding this mission.



NOUMC Financial Snapshot

Through the first half of the year the church's regular giving was about \$8,100 under budget. Our expenses during the same period are about \$1,400 over budget. This difference is primarily due to higher-than-expected winter utility bills and insurance costs.

We would like to extend our gratitude to all those who have filled out a pledge card, contributing to both the operating budget and the capital campaign. This year, the capital campaign target was significantly reduced, largely thanks to the overwhelming amount of volunteer support we have received at the church. We feel incredibly fortunate to have such a dedicated and willing community of individuals who have generously offered their time and efforts to repair and maintain our property. The collective efforts of many have truly made the workload lighter, and we deeply appreciate everyone's contributions.

Please remember that each new giving year begins July 1, when we all begin contributing the new amounts we pledge during the Stewardship Campaign in May.

As always, our congregation has been very active with targeted missions. Among the most notable of those in May were:

- \$535 was donated for our ongoing Building Capital campaign.
- Penny Sunday collections in May totaled \$249 for the United Methodist Committee on Relief.
- We provided our regular monthly meal to the community on June 28.

Thanks for your continued generosity and faithfulness in supporting the financial needs of NOUMC. For anyone interested in more detailed financial information, the first half financial statements for the church are available in the office.

EarthKeepers Training Opportunities in October

If you'd like to act on the call to care for God's creation, Global Ministries' EarthKeepers program can help you to make a lasting difference. EarthKeepers is a training program that equips laity and clergy to launch and grow environmental projects in their communities. When you become an EarthKeeper, you receive training in project planning, community organizing, ecotheology, and antiracism. You also connect with a whole community of United Methodists who are passionate about caring for the earth. Back home, you'll receive ongoing project support and technical guidance as you carry out your project. Training will be held October 5-8, 2023 in three locations: Birmingham, Alabama, Denver, Colorado and Hartford, Connecticut. Except for your transportation to the training location, the cost of the program is underwritten by Global Ministries. Nurture's mission is to minister to members of the congregation so they know they are loved and cared for by their church community. We send out cards, make food deliveries when needed, reach out with phone calls and visits, and send special packages during holidays, school exam times, and sometimes just for fun. Last year we organized a program with North Olmsted Senior Services, which led to preparing a list of services available to our members (copies of which can be found in Fellowship Hall or requested from a Nurture Team Member.) We're always looking for a way to support our church family, and often have a lot of fun doing it, like when we take ice cream treats to people.
