Update on Africa University EOC—Dorm Construction



The East Ohio Conference raised and collected more than \$1.5M under the Teach*Reach*Bless campaign to build a female dormitory which addresses the growing demand for on-campus housing at Africa University. Women represent about 58 percent of the student population and are, at times, more vulnerable and financially challenged when commuting long distances to the campus daily. Construction of the 3-story, 90-bed facility began in February and is scheduled to be completed by November. Thank you to all EOC churches that contributed to this dorm's cost.

October Penny Sunday Mission: Maui Fire Relief/Global Ministries Advance #901670



As you probably know, on August 8, 2023 high winds and downed power lines caused the deadliest wildfire incident in the U.S. in over a century on the **island of Maui**, **and the worst natural disaster in Hawaii's history**. In Lahaina (the first capitol of the Hawaiian culture), the death total stands at 97 with 31 to 41 people still missing. Approximately 2,220 structures were damaged or destroyed in Lahaina and elsewhere in the upcountry of Maui. The fires burned more than 2,500 acres of land on an island that is just 48 miles long and 26 miles wide. Many families were left homeless without any of their belongings as they escaped the rapidly moving

fire. It will take years to recover from the devastation in Lahaina.

Let us come together to help the people of Maui and extend our own "aloha spirit" which means to:

- *Appreciate everything and be thankful for the beauty of the world around you. ...
- *Pay homage to nature. ...
- *Stay rooted in your 'ohana (your family). ...
- *Be kind.

NOUMC Financial Snapshot

Thanks for your continued generosity and faithfulness in supporting the financial needs of NOUMC. Through August, the church's regular giving was about \$17,100 less than was budgeted. Our expenses during the same period are running about as expected. Giving has dropped significantly during the summer months as many people have been away. If you have been away, please remember to send your summer pledge to the church.

The church invested \$5,900 in August to repair and repave a portion of the entry drive near our front door. In early August, the church paid to the East Ohio Conference the first half of our Shared Ministries apportionment for 2023.


