#### March Penny Sunday: Support Our Midwest Disaster Relief Mission


This month's Penny Sunday offering will be going to the Midwest Disaster Relief Mission. They do amazing projects! From January-June in 2023, \$3.83 million in humanitarian aid was sent. There were 1,364 on-site volunteers and 3,161 off-site volunteers for the mission, as well as 125 domestic shipments and 26 international shipments (including to Ukraine). Session 4 - "Woman, here is your son," and to the disciple, "Here is your mother."


Session 5 - "I'm Thirsty"




