UWF News—From Barb Andrews

Include what you want the donation for and how much you would like. We don't guarantee we will take care of all requests or financial amounts, but we will consider them

Remember to check out the craft cart and card rack. There are some new crafts, as well as some of the originals. You might find some decorations or gifts to purchase. Leave your money in the box attached to the cart.

Mission News—From Barb Andrews

Thanks from The Oxcart Pantry. Sixty-four boxes of cereal made it there last month. We can continue collecting the Thanksgiving-type items, but we really need Stocking Stuffers for our collection this month. They can all go all into the green container under the name tags, and we'll sort them.

Going on about the Stocking Stuffers, we will be collecting items until December 8. If you're new to this project or need a reminder, we fill Christmas stockings to be given out at the Oxcart Pantry. We aim for a minimum of 60 stockings, which amount to 15 each for women, men, boys, and girls, but we'd love to make more. The items needed include stockings, toiletries, and small gifts. A more complete list can be found elsewhere in the Agape, but you can use your own imagination. If you'd prefer, you can make a donation to the Penny Sunday collection. That is our collection charity this month.

NOUMC Financial Snapshot

NOUMC has a generous congregation. Through its regular giving and targeted donations, the congregation donated approximately \$170,400 to support the mission of NOUMC during the first nine months of the year. In addition to its regular giving, the congregation also donated approximately \$17,600 for specifically targeted global and local ministries. \$2,300 was earned in rental income for the first three quarters. A one-time special donation of \$10,000 was received in July. The combination of these items resulted in the church receiving approximately \$20,000 more than anticipated during this period. Thank you!

During the first nine months of the year, total expenses are close to the amount projected (under budget by approximately 1.1% of budgeted expenses). It is worth noting that the budget anticipates that the church will pay a significantly reduced portion (25%) of its shared ministries apportionments for 2024.

The church expects to expend approximately \$14,000 from its Capital Building Fund in 2024, to replace aging windows in the sanctuary and remove or trim several trees damaged in the August storms. \$5,000 of that was pre-paid in September. Please consider a donation to help replenish the Building Fund. As always, our congregation has been very generous supporting the targeted missions of the church. Below are a few of the most significant such donations so far this year:


