The Lorain Men's Shelter is a temporary year-round overnight shelter at St. Elizabeth Center that serves 50 men who are homeless or at risk of homelessness. It focuses on men who have special needs and provides help with medicines, mail distribution, showers, state IDs, meals, transportation, and case management services. NOUMC provides a meal once a month for \$125 and is our Penny Sunday charity this month.

#### Adult Sunday School Begins September 15th
