

She left a Medicare 101 booklet and information on Medicare and Medicaid enrollment, senior transportation, fitness, and community meals available in the area. A copy of this information is hanging on the bulletin board next to the choir room. In addition, she left a sample event and meal calendars. Note that a Medicare specialist is on hand if you need assistance with open enrollment. You can reach out to Erica at (440) 777-8100.
