I have been fortunate to have served in rural, suburban, and urban settings and to close my time as an Ordained Elder with the people of North Olmsted UMC. I love you and will always love you beyond words I can express.

Please be reassured of my commitment to serve as faithfully as possible with leadership in worship, pastoral care, and administration until my last day in ministry with you on June 30, 2025. Please also be reassured that our Staff Parish Relations Committee is working diligently with District Superintendents, Rev. Bruce Hitchcock and Rev. Angela Lewis, and Bishop Hee-Soo Jung's Cabinet in the decision-making and appointment process for your next pastor who will begin ministry with you on July 1, 2025.

# January Penny Sunday: UMCOR NC Hurricane Relief

Historic rainfall, flooding, power outages and 140 mph winds plagued the Southeast, with the mountains of western North Carolina being particularly hard hit. According to The Associated Press, at least 179 people over six states were killed as a result of the storm, which made landfall in the Big Bend area of the Florida Gulf Coast as a Category 4 storm on Sept. 26.



### **Adult Sunday School Starts New Series**



On January 12, the Adult Sunday School class, led by Claudia Taller, will begin a new 6-week series called "Fierce: Women of the Bible who Changed the World," through Amplify video. The video series is led by speaker and writer Jennifer Cowart. From Amplify: It's become trendy to use the word "fierce" when describing women at the top of their game, but women have been fiercely changing the world for thousands of years." We'll start with two midwives and end with exploring how Timothy's mother and grandmother changed the world. The series will also focus on Deborah, Nahman's slave girl, Tabitha, and the woman at the well. Can we be fierce? Many women in history have received little fanfare yet lived fiercely anyway. In this six-week study we will look at lesser-known female characters in the Bible and the ways they changed the world by living into God's calling. The study is for all of us, men included.
