Ash Wednesday Service Wednesday, March 5 at 7pm

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent, a season of forty days (minus Sundays) during which we prepare ourselves for the events of Holy Week and Easter. We start the journey of Lent with confession, pardon, and the imposition of ashes, a reminder of our mortality. Though this can often feel like a serious service as Psalm 51:1 says, "Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love." We will begin Lent with the reminder that God's love is steadfast—it never fails. In words like those of Coldplay's "Fix You," God's love is like a light that guides us home, ignites our bones, and fixes us, putting us back together for relationship with God and one another. —Pastor Hoyte


Adult Lenten Outing: Tetelestai-Cleveland's Own Passion Play



In "Witness at the Cross," Amy-Jill Levine shows how the people at the cross each have distinct roles to play in the Gospels. For each, Jesus has a particular meaning and message, and from each, we learn how those meanings and messages cross the centuries to any who would come to the cross today.

Experience Holy Friday from the perspective of those who watched Jesus die: Mary his mother; the Beloved Disciple from the Gospel of John; Mary Magdalene and the other women from Galilee; the two men, usually identified as thieves, crucified with Jesus; the centurion and the soldiers; Joseph of Arimathea and Nicodemus. Jews and Romans, friends and strangers, the powerful and the powerless, the hopeful and the despairing.


Mission News—From Barb Andrews

Do you have family or church members who are currently incarcerated or have come home following incarceration?

Many of us do.

Does your congregation have a desire to restore hope and support healing among this often-overlooked population through community ministries?

We hope so.

This All In Community Dinner & Discussion provides individuals an opportunity to understand better how to navigate Ohio's criminal justice system with loved ones, congregants, and neighbors. Family members, ministry servants, and pastors have an opportunity to learn how they can support people close to them who are incarcerated and returning. No family member or congregation can do it alone, so we will identify local resource partners that strengthen our supportive response as part of the reentry continuum of care. Through the All In Community ministry framework, participants will better understand both important direct tangible needs *and* spiritual, social, and emotional needs that restore hope and support healing during and following incarceration.
